Concert description:

"Music gathers people." The belief that music can break down borders is deeply held and shared by the members of the Ladom Ensemble. From Persian music to Balkan folklore to fresh takes on great classics, this concert transcends borders through an implicit musical multiculturalism. This unconventional group, made up of artists from across the country, brings together piano, cello, accordion, and percussion to put a new spin on arrangements and original compositions. Length of the performance: 90 minutes (two 45-minute parts)

Length of the intermission: 20 minutes

Number of artists on stage: 4

Typical schedule:

JMC requires the concert hall to be available at least four (4) hours before the concert for rehearsal and set-up.

• 3:00 p.m. : artists' arrival

• 3:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. : lighting set-up and soundcheck

• 4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. : rehearsal dress rehearsal


• 5:00 p.m. : dinner

• 6:00 p.m. : crew call

• 7:00 p.m. : doors open

Technical needs:

- One (1) concert piano tuned on the day of the concert to A 440;
- One (1) adjustable piano bench;
- Two (2) microphones on stands for comments during the concert;
- Three (3) straight back chairs without arms;
- Three (3) music stands with lamps.

Required staff:

- One (1) technician to set up stage lighting and to respond to the artists' questions and needs;
- One (1) sound technician;
- One (1) person to sell CDs;
- One (1) page turner.

Sound:

Concert is acoustic, but can be amplified for larger venues.

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Lighting:

- Basic stage lighting for a classical concert;
- Requires light to read music from music stand.

Transportation and delivery:

- Equipment and artists arrive by car;
- Artists will bring the printed programs to be distributed to the audience;
- A freestanding JMC banner will be installed in the concert hall's foyer.

Hospitality:

- 1 parking space in close proximity to the loading area of the concert hall.
- Two (2) dressing rooms;
- Twelve (12) bottles of water;
- Iron and ironing board;
- Snacks for four (4);
- Coat rack and hangers;
- Four (4) towels, if possible.

Merchandising:

The presenter agrees to allow the artist to sell CDs at intermission and following the performance. The artists will be available following the concert to meet the audience and autograph CDs. Unless otherwise agreed at least two (2) weeks prior to the concert, the presenter will not charge a commission on sales and the full revenue of sales will be given to the artists before their departure.

Note: The artist will call the technical director at least two (2) days before the concert to confirm all technical details.

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
