

Nuné Melik, violinist

Nuné Melik is an emerging violinist on the international stage. Based in Montreal and New York, she made her solo debut at the Stern Auditorium of Carnegie Hall in 2016 to great acclaim. She also appeared as an invited artist at the United Nations Headquarters in New York. As a soloist and chamber musician, Nuné has performed throughout Russia, Canada, the United States, Germany, Denmark, Italy, France and Armenia. Since 2015, Nuné Melik holds an Artist-in-Residence position with the Miami Chamber Orchestra.

Nuné Melik is a winner of the Waldo Mayo Competition (2016) and Canada Council for the Arts Competition (2015), among others. She is a top prize winner of various international competitions, including the Prix d'Europe, and a grant and award winner of the AGBU Arts Fellowship (New York), the McGill Excellence Fellowship and the Urartu Fellowship (Moscow). Nuné is an expert of the music of Caucasus and has given numerous lectures based on her research.

Nuné Melik plays on a Carlo Ferdinando Violin (1760) on loan from the Canada Council for the Arts' Musical Instrument Bank.
